- INTRO;
- It has been said that "Imitation is the highest form of flattery" 1
 - We have lost the art of imitation with the need to be authentic. We resonate with quotes like, "Be yourself, everyone else is taken."² Which was updated recently by the Lego movie, "Always be yourself, unless you can be Batman, then always be Batman"
 - The concept of authenticity which is defined as "not false or copied; genuine", and is at least partly biblical to not be false, as not to be a hypocrite, which gets its roots in being an actor and wearing a mask. ³ Adam and Eve "covered" themselves in the garden; hiding their fear, shame and guilt, creating for all of us a tendency to carry a facade.
 - I was challenged many years ago to constantly seek to remove lenses of worldly philosophies and replace them with biblical ones. (exegesis vs eisegesis) For instance; "Existentialism is a philosophy that emphasizes individual existence, freedom and choice." Which sounds good at first, especially since one of its core values is authenticity, but it goes on "that humans define their own meaning in life" and "holds that, as there is no God or any other transcendent force, the only way to counter this nothingness (and hence to find meaning in life) is by embracing existence." ⁴ Thus, to be authentic and create your own meaning, purpose

& value. Could parts of this popular philosophy be effecting the way you read the Bible, understand life and change your purpose?

• Is it biblical? Has not God defined our meaning, purpose and value? And what about the art of imitation? Are we not called to imitate Jesus? Could Oscar Wilde, the Irish poet who said, "imitation is the highest form of flattery" be on to something? That imitating Jesus is a high form of praise to the one who saved?

whoever says he abides in him (Jesus) ought to walk in the same way in which he walked. 1 John 2:6

Would it not be better to say, "Always be yourself, unless you can be like Jesus, then always be like Jesus"

Which leads me into my main point this morning, "Be like Jesus"

- Context, Jesus is spending time with the people he has been spending time with but, starting in John 13 we get a magnifying glass to the relationship and lessons Jesus gives his disciples. Before we get to the specifics of our text, let's not forget how he got to this point.

#1. JESUS IS DISCIPLING

How? He is living the great commission as an example for us. He is revealing himself to people and teaching them. Making himself available for others to follow, to be like, to learn from, to imitate as he lived as humanity was meant to live! Why? What was his motive?

Read vs. 1

#2. JESUS' MOTIVE IS LOVE.

Jesus is God and God is love.

Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest (fully known, revealed, made clear) among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. 1 John 4:8-10

The Father's motive for sending his son is love, Jesus revealed that love by loving us to death.... His motive for coming is love

Read vs. 2-3

#3. IDENTITY OF JESUS

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. John 1:1–5

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. Colossians 1:15–20

the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Phil 2:9b-11

And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

1. LOVE

As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. John 15:9-13

-Even in this commandment, sacrificial love and service is built in.

#4. Serve

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Philippians 2:3-8

Even your enemies

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? Matthew 5:43-47
