A. Walk has its root word in the idea of treading. Think treading grapes.

- 1. But it's all of us together, walking with intention, more like a march.
- 2. Have everyone stand and march in place. Might be tough since our clapping is not stellar! Bring up a few volunteers and march in line. Have one follow the next. Have the person following March less intentional and the wrong direction.

All translations use this EXCEPT the Message, which uses the name, Syzygus, which means true companion.

ESV, NKJV- Who have labored side by side (with me) in the Gospel NASB-who have shared my struggle in the cause of the Gospel NIV- Contended at my side in the cause...

*NOTES

NIV uses "destiny" rather than "end" in vs. 19. A brief study of the Greek says "a point of time marking the end of a duration"². "End" may be a better word and destiny may be a stretch, but many uses of the word speak to the end times so I do think Paul is speaking to an "end" ending with judgement rather than grace.

vs. 3b NIV used "contended" vs. "labored" which, though they are different words in the Greek, seems to allude to the "straining" Paul speaks to in 3:13b.

The biggest notable difference in translations is vs. 21b. Each one offering a slight variation with NKJV leaving out the word "power" and ESV & NIV saying "enables" referring to "work" (NKJV) or "exertion" (NASB). *Look up Greek

The Message stands alone in much of the wording.

The Message

Stick with me, friends. Keep track of those you see running this same course, headed for this same goal. There are many out there taking other paths, choosing other goals, and trying to get you to go along with them. I've warned you of them many times; sadly, I'm having to do it again. All they want is easy street. They hate Christ's Cross. But easy street is a dead-end street. Those who live there make their bellies their gods; belches are their praise; all they can think of is their appetites.

20-21 But there's far more to life for us. We're citizens of high heaven! We're waiting the arrival of the Savior, the Master, Jesus Christ, who will transform our earthy bodies into glorious bodies like his own. He'll make us beautiful and whole with the same powerful skill by which he is putting everything as it should be, under and around him.

1 4 My dear, dear friends! I love you so much. I do want the very best for you. You make me feel such joy, fill me with such pride. Don't waver. Stay on track, steady in God.

Pray About Everything

- 2 I urge Euodia and Syntyche to iron out their differences and make up. God doesn't want his children holding grudges.
- 3 And, oh, yes, Syzygus, since you're right there to help them work things out, do your best with them. These women worked for the Message hand in hand with Clement and me, and with the other veterans—worked as hard as any of us. Remember, their names are also in the Book of Life.³

Euodia [\bar{u} \bar{o} 'dĭ $\bar{\bullet}$] (Gk. Euodia "prosperous journey"). A woman who belonged to the church at Philippi (Phil. 4:2; KJV "Euodas"). She and Syntyche, who both may have held prominent positions in the congregation and had apparently been close associates of Paul (v. 3; on the role of women at Philippi, cf. Acts 16:13ff.), had become embroiled in a dispute of some sort, sufficient enough to prompt the imprisoned apostle to entreat their reconciliation and to enlist one of their colleagues as mediator (see Yokefellow).⁴

Syntyche (Σ uv τ u χ η , Syntychē). A woman in the church at Philippi whom Paul admonishes to settle a dispute with Euodia (Phil 4:2).

Her name means "fortunate," or literally, "with fate." Euodia and Syntyche were among Paul's first converts in Philippi who "struggled" along with Paul in the gospel (Phil 4:3).⁵

Yokefellow. (True Companion, ESV) The literal translation of Gk. sýzygos "comrade" or "companion," applied to a member (or possibly members) of the church at Philippi charged by Paul to help Euodia and Syntyche resolve their quarrel (Phil. 4:2-3). Scholars have speculated about the identity of this "true yokefellow" and have suggested various persons known from Paul's ministry, such as Epaphroditus, Silas, Luke, Lydia, Timothy, or Titus. More cautious commentators have proposed several less specific options: a well-known associate of Paul's, a leader at Philippi whose name is not mentioned; an otherwise unknown church member whose name is not given; an otherwise unknown church member named Syzygus (unlikely because the word is unattested elsewhere as a name); and the whole congregation addressed as one person⁶

It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the man of heaven, so also are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven.

I tell you this, brothers: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we

shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. 1 Corinthians 15:43-53

This reference is a strong theology for the resurrection. It would seem Paul is arguing for a spiritual only (No new bodies) until he says, For this perishable body *must put on* the imperishable, and this mortal body *must put on* immortality.

Hosea was a prophet to the northern Kingdom. He "depicts Israel's unfaithfulness with a number of images from family and nature. Israel is like: a promiscuous wife, an

indifferent mother, an illegitimate child, an ungrateful son, a stubborn heifer, a silly dove, a luxuriant vine, and grapes in the wilderness. Yet Israel's unfaithfulness and obstinacy are not enough to exhaust God's redeeming love that outstrips the human capacity to comprehend."¹¹

The context for 4:7 starts with the LORD saying "There is no faithfulness or steadfast love, and no knowledge of God in the land" (4:1b) and lists the vile deeds of the city. Then it focuses on the Religious leaders who have failed to lead the people.

"Yet let no one contend, and let none accuse, for with you is my contention, O priest. You shall stumble by day; the prophet also shall stumble with you by night; and I will destroy your mother.

My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge; **because you have rejected knowledge, I reject you from being a priest to me**. And since you have forgotten the law of your God, I also will forget your children."Hosea 4:4-6

The more they increased, the more they sinned against me; I will change their glory into shame. They feed on the sin of my people; they are greedy for their iniquity. And it shall be like people, like priest; I will punish them for their ways and repay them for their deeds. Hosea 4:4-9

Therefore, Paul is hyperlinking this thought in his letter to the Philippians. These "knife happy circumcisers" in Pauls day are the same type of leaders that led to the exile of the Northern Kingdom by the Assyrians.
