Main Point: Jesus' way is Joy Complete

Intro

What we are looking for... Eternal life, the fountain of youth, all ways too overcome our fear of death.

Joy; whole crusades, movements, societies, have search and sought to create an earthly nirvana.

True connection and relationship. Can it be that there is an answer to these soul desires?

Jesus

Life- Word of Life/ The Eternal Life

In him was <u>life</u>, and the <u>life</u> was the light of men. John 1:4

"I am the resurrection and the <u>life</u>. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he <u>live</u>," John 11:25

"I am the way, and the truth, and the <u>life</u>. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

And we know that the Son of God <u>has come</u> and has given us understanding, so that we may know him who is true; and we are in him who is true, in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life. 1 John 5:20

Gospel-> Resurrection, Jesus' way is Joy Complete

Initial Thoughts

His main point is clear—> JOY COMPLETE. (We are writing these things) He bases this joy on; 1. Jesus, the eternal life, 2. fellowship (relationship) with a. Each other b. With God.

Vs. 1, See notes on "Life" sermon

Vs. 2, He continues to he thoughts on the "word of life". The "life was made manifest" (study greek). What life? The Word of life. "We have seen it"- Verification of witness. "Testify and proclaim-> THE Eternal Life; with the Father (John 1:2-4) and made "manifest" (Greek study) to "us" (the OG disciples).

Vs. 3, This "life" that was "seen and heard" "we proclaim" SO THAT; fellowship (Greek) with OG's AND God (Father & Son) AND JOY COMPLETE!

-The difference of "our" vs. "your" is summed up nicely by the Msg; We want you to enjoy this, too. Your joy will double our joy!

Translations

Vs. 1 See notes from "life"

Vs. 2 the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us-

NIV-The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us.

NASB-Same as ESV

NKJV-the life was manifested, and we have seen, and bear witness, and declare to you that eternal life which was with the Father and was manifested to us—

CEB-that life was revealed, and we have seen it and we testify and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us—

NLT-This one who is life itself was revealed to us, and we have seen him. And now we testify and proclaim to you that he is the one who is eternal life. He was with the Father, and then he was revealed to us.

MSG-The Word of Life appeared right before our eyes; we saw it happen! And now we're telling you in most sober prose that what we witnessed was, incredibly, this: The infinite Life of God himself took shape before us.

*Thoughts- manifest:Appeared, revealed, we saw it happen / testify:bear witness, declare / we're telling you in most sober prose.

Greek

Manifest: to cause to become visible²

Testify:to provide information about a person or an event concerning which the speaker has direct knowledge—'to witness.³

Vs. 3 that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.

NIV-We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

NASB-Same as ESV

NKJV-that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ.

CEB-what we have seen and heard we also declare to you, so that you may also have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

NLT-We proclaim to you what we ourselves have actually seen and heard so that you may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

MSG-We saw it, we heard it, and now we're telling you so you can experience it along with us, this experience of communion with the Father and his Son, Jesus Christ.

*Thoughts-Proclaim:declare, we're telling you

Greek:to announce or inform, with possible focus upon the source of information—'to tell, to inform.'4

Vs. 4-And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

NIV-We write this to make our joy complete.

NASB-These things we write, so that our joy may be made complete.

NKJV-And these things we write to you that your joy may be full.

CEB-Same as ESV

NLT-We are writing these things so that you may fully share our joy.

MSG-Our motive for writing is simply this: We want you to enjoy this, too. Your joy will double our joy!

Greek

Fellowship:an association involving close mutual relations and involvement–'close association, fellowship.' ⁵

Joy: a state of joy and gladness–'joy, gladness, great happiness⁷

Throughout John's Gospel fulfilment and joy are related to the person of Jesus.

The fact that this joy is attained by keeping the commandments does not mean that ethical action is the way of salvation; it is to be understood in the framework of all that is said about the commandment of love. Love is not a means to win through to eschatological existence. It is rather the leading of this life.⁸

Complete:to make something total or complete. Means "to fill," e.g., a bottle with water. By revelation "everything" is received, the "complete fulness" of the actuality of salvation itself. Joy is perfected because it is given by the fulness of salvation which is granted with the exaltation of Jesus. Jn. 16:24 does not deviate from this specific line of usage, for here there is granted to the man who prays for the salvation given in fellowship with Christ (cf. v. 22f.) the promise that he will receive the gift of perfect joy (in this fellowship). 10

People

Father-Jesus was "with" and now our "fellowship" is with him. This should be no small truth. We have "mutual abiding" (Greek) with him.

Jesus-The word of life, the eternal life, witnessed and testified by "us" and "we".

The "we" is assumed but yet, clear based on context, the disciples (original followers of) Jesus.

You- The reader, so that you too may have fellowship with "us" (the disciples) thereby the Father and son, thus, joy complete.

*Thoughts- The first thing to note is the massive list of cross references listed in each verse which speaks to the density of these verses. Also noted is the consistent themes not only in 1 John but in the Gospel of John as well. Of these, 46 cross references, 28 are from John's writings.
