The main idea last week was, "Believe that. Love this". Believe God, who knows all, over your heart's condemnation. Love the church, the people of God. The next verse is an imperative; "Do not believe", which seems intentional.- Believe

this. Do Not believe this. This section is clearly set up by 3:24, which is a contrast between the "spirit" of the antichrist (vs. 3) and the true Spirit who God has given us. (READ vs. 24-Vs. 1)

The imperative is either 2 commands or part 1 and 2 of the same command. "But" is a contrast word that could mean and.¹ When considering 3:24 with 4:1 you could say; [24] God abides in us. How do we know? By this, the one true Spirit lives in us. [4:1] BUT, you who are loved by God, not every 'spirit' is of God; don't believe them and test everything. But though they knew him, they did not acknowledge him" (Letters of John, 157). Plummer asserts that "we are not to suppose that all other articles of faith are unimportant ... but against the errors prevalent in that age this was the great safeguard" (Epistles of S. John, 95). Marshall says that "it is possible that John's opponents thought they could confess Jesus as Lord but without accepting the fact that he was the Word incarnate, and therefore John had to stress that the confession must be made in this particular form" (Epistles of John, 206). Another "by this" statement. This is a clear and direct affront to the false teaching of the day.

This is known as Docetism, which is a form of Gnosticism.

"The problem with Docetism is that it denies the core truths of the gospel, namely, the death and resurrection of Christ. If Jesus did not have a real body, then He did not really die (Docetism teaches that His suffering on the cross was mere illusion). And, if Jesus had no physical body, He could not have risen bodily from the dead. Without the actual death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we have no salvation, we are still in our sins, and our faith is futile." Gotquestions.org

It's picked up again in 2 John 2:7.

For many deceivers have gone out into the world, those who do not confess the coming of Jesus Christ in the flesh. Such a one is the deceiver and the antichrist. 2 John 7

What's interesting is there this is not a universal statement. In other words, there are people who believe he came in the flesh but are also of the Antichrist; Mormons, JW's, Muslims, etc. You can't say emphatically that anyone who believes Jesus came in the flesh is *from God*. Plus, the Gospel of John is clear about his divinity. Therefore, he states this specifically, BUT more generally speaking he is saying this;

"he now provides the actual test itself. What do you think about Jesus the Christ? John gives the way in which one can recognize (ginōskete) "the Spirit of God." The test itself is comprehensive. Every spirit (pan pneuma) will either be approved or rejected based on the Christological test. Not only is the test comprehensive, but it is also confessional. The legitimacy of a prophet should be determined by the content of his message, his confession about Jesus. The verb "acknowledges" (homologei) indicates an unwavering confession and

"denotes not mere verbal acknowledgment but an open and forthright declaration of the message as one's own position." It is the outward expression of inner faith. The content of the expression is crucial, and it must acknowledge that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh (en sarki)."²

True faith in the true Christ=true life. This is a good reminder of our series "Narrative"; all cults seem to have a deviation of 2 things; Who Christ *is* and/or what Christ has done (the Gospel). This is also shown by the more general statement in vs. 3.

Read Vs. 3

The term "spirit of the antichrist" seems to refer to "many antichrists (that) have come" that John refers to in 2:18-19 and that there is a spirit motivating them.

Children, it is the last hour, and as you have heard that antichrist is coming, so now many antichrists have come. Therefore we know that it is the last hour. [19] They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would have continued with us. But they went out, that it might become plain that they all are not of us. 1 John 2:18-19

This seems to be a PSA. A little FYI for your spiritual life, which means we need to be careful who we are listening to. One of the main points of 1 John is TRUTH, [2:26] *I write these things to you about those who are trying to deceive you.* Yes, there is a battle which is clearly a spiritual one. But it's the battle of knowing and believing. The attacks on the church from then to now is deception.

The things of the "spiritual" usually scare us a bit. But the battle is less about a demon under every rock and more about knowing and living in truth. Yes, attacks will come. It makes sense since we serve a different God and are of a different kingdom. But it's not ying and yang, 2 powers of equal power; but a sovereign, all powerful, all knowing, ever present God who is also patient, loving and good who has allowed one of his creation to live in rebellion against him. And one day, he will be punished, but thank God that day didn't already come... for we would never know the grace of God found in Jesus Christ.

Job- Satan has to ask permission. So why does God allow this rebellious spirit to affect his children?

NLT-Dear friends, do not believe everyone who claims to speak by the Spirit. You must test them to see if the spirit they have comes from God. For there are many false prophets in the world.

MSG-My dear friends, don't believe everything you hear. Carefully weigh and examine what people tell you. Not everyone who talks about God comes from God. There are a lot of *lying preachers loose in the world.

*Thoughts- I like how the AMP says "faith". Though the Greek word can be used interchangeably, in our day saying, "I believe you", doesn't necessarily mean you trust the person, but in this verse believing what they say and trusting the person saying it, seems to be implied.

July 5, 2023 at 4:23:11 PM Every spirit (not so much the personal teacher as the principle or tendency of the doctrine) which confesseth not Jesus. This is the true reading, the words Χριστὸνἐν σαρκὶ ἐληλυθότα being a spurious addition from ver. 1. As so often, St. John states the case both negatively and positively for emphasis. There is an ancient variant reading of much interest, probably of Latin origin, which can be traced back to the second century, being known to Tertullian and Irenæus. For μή όμολογεί τὸν Ἰησοῦν it gives λύει τὸν Ίησοῦν, solvit Jesum. This corruption of the text was evidently aimed at those who distinguished the man Jesus from the Divine Christ, and thus "dissolved" his Personality. The Greek manuscripts are quite unanimous against the reading.

ESV-[2] By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God,

NIV- *This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God,

AMP- By this you may know (perceive and recognize) the Spirit of God: every spirit which acknowledges and confesses [the fact] that Jesus Christ (the Messiah) [actually] has become man and has come in the flesh is of God [has God for its source];

NLT- This is how we know if *they have the Spirit of God: If a person claiming to be a prophet acknowledges that Jesus Christ came in a real body, that person has the Spirit of God.

MSG-Here's how you test for the genuine Spirit of God. Everyone who confesses openly his faith in Jesus Christ–the Son of God, who came as an actual flesh-and-blood person–comes from God and belongs to God.

*Thoughts- "By this". The NIV, NLT & MSG use the idea of *how*- by means of, which makes sense. (*See "Reassure" study notes, "By this"*). The NLT adds an interesting twist to this verse. Note how all the other translations seem to be emphatic- recognize or know the "Spirit of God", yet the NLT says, 'know if <u>they have</u> the Spirit of God', which its understandable, since the main subject is the false prophets from vs. 1.

4:3

ESV-[3] and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you heard was coming and now is in the world already.

The KVJ and KNJV add "in the flesh" after "does not confess Jesus". I get the idea, since it is carrying over from 4:2, but it's not what the original says, so it seems to be adding to the word unnecessarily.

4:4

ESV-[4] Little children, you are from God and have overcome them, for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.

4:5
